# CLAPHAM COMMON (CL 209) RIGHT ENTRY 12 AND BURN MOOR (CL270) RIGHT ENTRY 5

An application has been made to North Yorkshire Council by F & K under Schedule 3 (3)(c) of the Commons Act 2006. The application seeks to record a historic severance of the rights of common registered at right entry number 12 of common land unit CL 209, known as Clapham Common and right entry 5 of common land unit CL270, known as Burn Moor.

The Registration Authority is satisfied that the application complies with the requirements of Schedule 3(3)(c) of the Commons Act 2006 and Schedule 4 Paragraph 19 of the Commons Registration (England) Regulations 2014 with regard to the right to graze 40 ewes with followers, 10 hogs and 7 cows during May, registered at right entry no. 12 and listed as being attached to land known as Dovenanter End Farm, Keasden and the right to graze 40 ewes with followers, 10 hogs and 7 cows during May, registered at right entry no.5 and listed as being attached to land known as Dovenanter End Farm, Keasden, being shared rights . In consequence, the Commons Registration Authority has determined that the application be granted.

The Registration Authority has therefore amended right entry 12 of the Rights Section of the Common Land Register unit number CL 209 and right entry 5 of the Rights Section of the Common Land Register unit number CL 270, in accordance with the Commons Registration (England) Regulations 2014 to reflect the severance of the rights of common previously attached to land known as Dovenanter End Farm registered at right entry 12 and 5 and becoming rights held in gross. It is not possible to sever an unquantifiable right to gather rushes and therefore this right will remain registered in the name of Peter Close and as being attached to the dwelling Dovenanter End Farm.
