STATEMENT OF THE COUNCIL'S REASONS FOR PROPOSING TO MAKE THE ORDER

North Yorkshire Council (NYC) was awarded funding from the government's Transforming Cities Fund (TCF) to deliver a project to boost sustainable travel within Harrogate.. The total package will deliver improvements comprising of:

- Changing the road space along Station Parade to provide space for bus priority, a new cycleway and footway improvements
- Improvements to the One Arch underpass
- Improvements to the public space at Station Square
- Upgrading crossing facilities

As a result it is necessary to introduce new Traffic Regulation Orders
