(30 MPH SPEED LIMIT) (VARIOUS ROADS, ALDBROUGH ST JOHN) **ORDER 2025**

NOTICE is hereby given that on 31 January 2025 The North Yorkshire Council made an Order under Sections 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, the effect of which is to prohibit any motor vehicle from travelling at a speed in excess of 30 miles per hour on any length of road specified below.

Column 1 Item	Columns 2 Road	Column 3 Length
1	Main Village Street	From a point 20 metres south west of its junction with the south side of Brick Kiln Lane (measured along the western kerb line), to a point 26 metres south of its junction with the south side of Kilton Court (measured along the eastern kerb line).
2	Road to Stanwick St John	From its junction with the main village street, to a point 65 metres west of its junction with the west side of Appleby Lane (measured along the southern kerb line).
3	Appleby Lane	From its junction with the road to Stanwick St John, for a distance of 95 metres in a south westerly direction (measured along the eastern kerb line).
4	Doctors Lane	From its junction with the main village street, to a point 31 metres south east of its junction with the east side of the vehicular access to the Doctors' Surgery (measured along the northern kerb line).
5	Road around Village Green	For its entire length.
6	St Johns Park	For its entire length.
7	Kilton Court	For its entire length.
8	Loop Road to the east of Main Village Street	For its entire length.
9	Spenceley Place	For its entire length.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks of 31 January 2025 make application to the High Court for the purpose.
