Cheryl, ref above. In the original consultation 2014/15 and regarding the provision of land for large area development, I proposed four sites I think - one of which was the BOCM site. I have read the majority of the latest Precis and noticed that the BOCM site development has become protracted due to problems agreeing Section 106 money/allocations. I think that the BOCM area negotiations was initiated by the then Dist. Cllr Percival around 2004/5 and indeed continued when he left office in 2006. The worrying factor is that if it is taking so long for BOCM to get off the ground then what little chance is there for the other three sites I have proposed to contribute to the housing total required of SDC?

You may wish to agree that urban development should take priority with its' existing infrastructure. Any comments on that please? In my mind, meeting Gov. requirements revolves around major developments and early agreements - or is that too simple? Regards David McSherry.

The Sites and Policies Local Plan - PLAN Selby Focussed Engagement Summer 2015

The Local Plan is being developed in collaboration with all stakeholders and will set out the planning policies and proposals for new development in the area to meet housing and employment needs as well as protecting key environmental assets.

This purpose of this six week focussed engagement is to invite comments on the work undertaken so far in preparing the Local Plan ('PLAN Selby') including draft studies and emerging findings.

We are writing now to about 1000 organisations and individuals from our Local Plan database to give advance notice of the start, format and content of the focused engagement and to invite comments. The invitees include everyone who submitted comments on the Initial Consultation, local groups, infrastructure organisations, landowners and developers and adjoining local authorities.

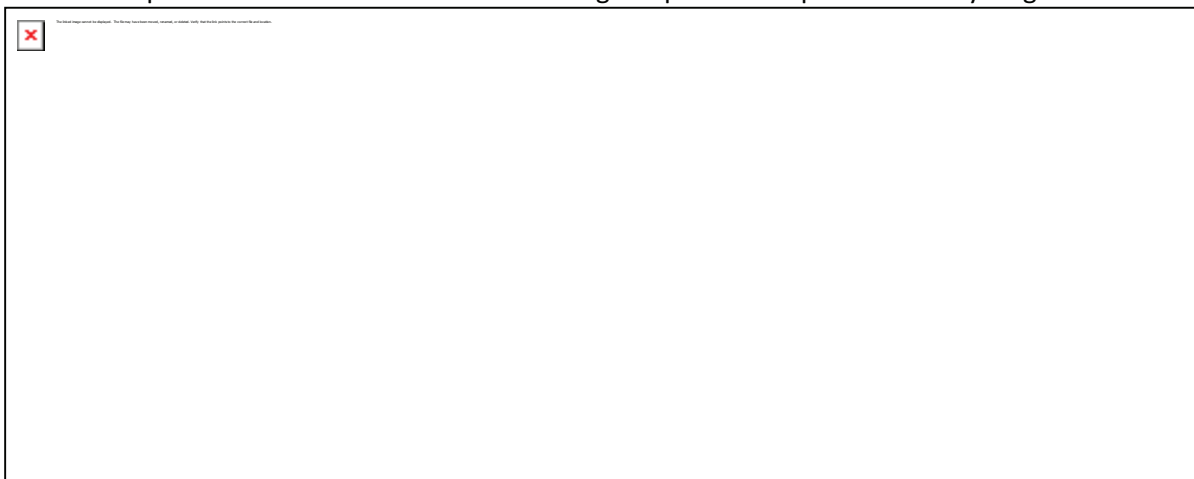
You will be able to look at the draft studies and consultation material when they are published on our website at www.selby.gov.uk/PLANSelby on 29 June. We are inviting you to make comments, in writing to ldf@selby.gov.uk by 10 August.

The range of studies will include:

- Draft Strategic Housing Market Assessment
- Draft Employment Land Review
- Site Allocations: A Draft Framework for Site Selection.
- Growth Options in Designated Service Villages
- Market Town Studies
- Draft Green Belt, Development Limits and Strategic Countryside Gaps Report

We are also talking to Parish and Town Councils, local businesses and landowners/developers as well as community representatives and other local groups through workshops, to which it is necessary to restrict numbers to invitation only (you will have already know about those if you have been invited).

The findings of the studies and feedback from this focused engagement (via both the workshops and the internet) will inform the scope and content of PLAN Selby. A substantial amount of further work will also be undertaken in order to develop and test options for delivering the planning policies and site allocations for the next stage of Plan preparation. You will have further opportunity to participate in the preparation of the Plan early next year when the Council will publish its Further Consultation setting out preferred options. The key stages are set out below:
