PLAN Selby should be explicit with regard to the effect of development in high risk flood areas. For example the secondary village of Ryther suffers significant annual flooding. Flooding in Ryther is in the main from inland water courses, surface or ground water not from the river Wharfe. Flooding occurs when large flows from other areas into the river are prevented by closure of valves during river flood conditions. This is a mechanism that well understood by EA and the Parish Council but often not by other agencies. The Ryther community with EA tries to reduce the effect when flooding occurs each year but often cannot, a situation that will worsen due to development in other areas without specific measures.

The significant development proposed in the designated service villages of Cawood, Church Fenton and Ulleskelf or the town of Sherburn in Elmet therefore will without additional control measures lead to increased annual flooding in Ryther including internal flooding of more property. Development in flood zones 1, 2, or 3 can cause this.

In such a known situation it can be considered a serious omission not to highlight in a separate PLAN Selby paragraph the known danger of consequential flood risk on other communities. Providing early awareness for subsequent users is an important factor in a document that is intended to inform. It is unacceptable to leave it to possible later consideration on a selected site by site basis and hope that safe solutions for all flooding will be provided through sequential testing. Without a specific control measure in PLAN Selby it could be more likely that sites will be allowed to develop over a number of years worsening serious flooding at Ryther, or in other communities, with no specific alleviation schemes to compensate.

Infrastructure needed at Ryther to combat increased flooding as a consequence of development in adjacent designated service villages is not currently identified. The intent of Plan Selby is to highlight importantant information in a District wide context in order to ensure appropriate decisions are made with knowledge of their impact. Necessary flood management infrastructure must therefore be included where flooding will increase as a result of development in designated service villages.

EA and Ryther Parish Council have already developed a low cost flood alleviation pumping scheme for installation on EA land. Although a financial contribution has been provided from the EA Local Levy Fund, implementation cannot proceed without further funding. A Project Plan is available and quotations from contractors have been obtained. It is imperative that the scheme is implemented prior to any development in adjacent DSVs under PLAN Selby. Please include this project in infrastructure needs.

Strategic Flood Risk Assessment. An update is noted as planned. Flood alleviation for Ryther must be identified and recommended in this update.
