However there are places like Selby Town where the wider sustainability benefits of development must be balanced against flood risk. Previously, the "Sequential Test" in assessing planning applications has been applied across the whole District, but now with the adoption of the Core Strategy it is appropriate to review this requirement and align the Sequential Test requirements with the Core Strategy spatial vision. To do this, the attached Draft Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) sets out new, smaller geographic areas to apply the Sequential Test to enable more easily the balancing of sustainability issues in determining planning applications.
