**Adoption Statement**  
**Selby District Core Strategy Local Plan**

The Selby District Core Strategy Local Plan (the Core Strategy) was adopted by Selby District Council on 22 October 2013.

The Core Strategy adopted by the Council includes the main modifications recommended by the Inspector and additional modifications which do not materially affect the policies in the Core Strategy (and which the Council is therefore entitled to make). The two sets of modifications were made pursuant to section 23(2A) and (3) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004. These main and additional modifications are set out in a tracked changes version of the Core Strategy.

Any person who is aggrieved by the adoption of the Selby District Core Strategy Local Plan may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the ground that:

- (a) the document is not within the appropriate power;
- (b) a procedural requirement has not been complied with.

Any application to the High Court must be made not later than 3 December 2013, this being the end of the period of six weeks starting with the date on which the Plan was adopted.
